This program aims to promote a research culture among students by encouraging them to explore issues relevant to their community, academic field, and future profession. We encourage all interested and motivated students to take this opportunity to strengthen their academic profile, contribute to local knowledge, and prepare for future research or professional careers.

Who Can Apply?

- Students currently enrolled in BA, B.Ed., BBS, or M.Ed. programs
- Individual or group (maximum of two students) proposals
- Each proposal must be supervised by a faculty member of Barun Multiple Campus

Priority Research Areas

- Student enrollment and dropout in higher education
- Local teaching-learning effectiveness and classroom practices
- Community involvement in education and development
- Climate change awareness and environmental issues
- Youth migration, local entrepreneurship, and livelihood
- ICT integration in education
- Cultural heritage, indigenous knowledge, and identity
- Internship/practicum effectiveness and career skills

Proposal Requirements

- Use the official 'Student Research Proposal Format' attached Guideline with this notice (also available from PRMC or Department)
- Proposal must include: Title, Background, Objectives, Research Questions, Methodology, Timeline, and Expected Outcomes
- Submit both printed and digital copies to the PRMC via your Department or provided campus email: barun.campus95@gmail.com

Deadline for Submission

July 14, 2025 (within 30 days of this notice)

Funding Support

- Selected student research proposals will receive a small grant as research seed money ranging from NPR 5,000 to NPR 10,000
- Eligible costs: printing, stationery, data collection, travel, etc.
- Receipts and a financial report are mandatory for fund clearance



1. Introduction

The **Barun Research Project, 2025** encourages students to develop research skills and apply theoretical knowledge to real-life issues. This guideline provides a clear framework for student-led research that contributes to academic growth, community development, and the institutional mission of Barun Multiple Campus.

2. Objectives of the Student Research Program

- To promote a research culture among undergraduate and postgraduate students
- To integrate classroom learning with field-based inquiry
- To engage students in identifying and addressing local social, economic, cultural, educational, and environmental issues
- To prepare students for academic writing, presentation, and further research work

3. Eligibility

- Students currently enrolled in **BA, B.Ed., BBS, and M.Ed.** programs
- Students in the final year or semester of their respective program are encouraged to apply
- Students must work under the supervision of a faculty member
- Individual or group (maximum 2 students) research is allowed

4. Priority Research Areas

Students are encouraged to select topics related to:

- Decreasing enrollment and dropout in higher education
- Teaching-learning effectiveness and classroom practices
- Community participation in education
- Climate change awareness and local environmental issues
- Youth migration, entrepreneurship, and livelihood challenges
- Indigenous knowledge and cultural preservation
- ICT integration and digital education
- Internship/practicum experiences and skill development

5. Research Proposal Submission

- Use the **Student Research Proposal Format** provided by the Planning and Research Management Committee (PRMC)
- The proposal should be approved by the **supervising teacher** and submitted to the PRMC
- Proposal includes: Title, Background, Objectives, Methodology, Timeline, Expected Outcomes, and Budget (if applicable)

6. Duration

- Research duration is **4 to 6 weeks**
- Must be completed within the academic year

7. Supervision and Support

- Each student/group must be supervised by a faculty member assigned or approved by the department
- Supervisors will guide topic selection, proposal development, fieldwork, and report writing

8. Budget and Support

- A small financial grant (up to NPR 5,000 to NPR 10,000) may be provided to selected proposals
- Eligible expenses include: stationery, printing, field visit travel, data collection materials
- Proper receipts and utilization reports must be submitted to RMC

9. Research Ethics

- Ensure informed consent from participants
- Maintain confidentiality and honesty in data reporting
- Avoid plagiarism; properly cite all sources
- Be respectful of cultural, gender, and community sensitivities

10. Research Report Format

The final report should include:

1. Title Page
2. Acknowledgment
3. Executive Summary
4. Introduction & Background
5. Objectives
6. Methodology
7. Data Presentation and Analysis
8. Findings and Discussion
9. Conclusion and Recommendations
10. References (APA 7th edition)
11. Annexes (Questionnaires, Tables, Photos, etc.)

11. Evaluation and Submission

- Submit **both hard and soft copies** of the final research report to the PRMC
- Students may be asked to present their findings in a Research Sharing Seminar
- Reports will be evaluated based on originality, relevance, clarity, and community usefulness

12. Recognition

- Certificate of Research Completion will be awarded upon successful submission
- Best research works will be selected for publication or presentation in campus journals and events

Some Critical Concern Research-specific Areas
BA, B.Ed., BBS, and M.Ed. Students of Barun Multiple Campus, Khandbari
Under the Barun Research Project
(Research themes are designed to promote local relevance, academic depth, and community impact while remaining manageable for student-level research)

1. Decreasing Enrollment and Dropout in Higher Education

- A. **Programs:** BA, B.Ed., M.Ed.
- B. **Focus:** Identify causes of declining student numbers and dropouts, especially among marginalized groups (e.g., Dalit, Janajati, women).
- C. **Purpose:** Suggest strategies for retention, motivation, and inclusive enrollment.

2. Teaching-Learning Practices and Students' Academic Performance

- A. **Programs:** B.Ed., M.Ed.
- B. **Focus:** Explore effectiveness of classroom methods, use of instructional materials, student engagement, and assessment techniques.
- C. **Purpose:** Recommend improved pedagogical strategies for rural higher education.

3. Community Participation in Education and Campus Development

- A. **Programs:** BA (BA, B.Ed., M.Ed.)
- B. **Focus:** Assess the level and nature of local community involvement in school/campus governance, volunteerism, or donations.

- **Population and Sample:** Who or what will be studied?
- **Sampling Method:** Random, purposive, etc.
- **Data Collection Tools:** Questionnaire, interview, observation, etc.
- **Data Analysis Plan:** How will you interpret the data?

- What do you hope to find?
- How will it be useful for the campus, society, or local development?


